Sue Hunter is a multi-media artist who works in watercolor, pastel, acrylic and oil. She describes her paintings as emotional suggestions of the subject matter. Her paintings contain unexpected colors and shapes and a bit of mystery which encourages the viewer to look closer. Although Sue is known for her rooster paintings, she also includes florals, animals, landscapes, figures and still life among her subject matter.

After graduating from Western International University, Sue has also studied art at the Scottsdale Artists School, Scottsdale Community College and at workshops with local and nationally-known artists.

Sue's paintings can be seen at the Raki Gallery in Jerome, Arizona; the Sedona Art Center in Sedona, Arizona, the Artismo Gallery in Surprise, Arizona, the Living Gallery in Ashland, Oregon and at local art exhibitions.

Sue is a popular art teacher, holding classes in watercolor, pastel and acrylic at Paradise Valley Community College, Shemer Art Center and at her Scottsdale studio.

ARNE WESTERMAN, AWS, NWS

AWA WORKSHOPS: APRIL 26 – 29

Arne Westerman's colorful, bold and dynamic style has won too many prestigious awards and memberships to list here. His website, www.arnewesterman.com, has an extensive list of his awards, memberships and examples of his work. Arne's warmth, talent and sense of humor have made him a popular workshop instructor as well. The title of one of his books, "How to Become a Famous Artist Through Pain and Suffering", tells you a great deal about Arne. He had talent and determination. Arne was also willing to work hard, sacrifice and make career decisions that led to his success.

After graduating with a BA in journalism Arne worked in advertising for many years. While there he learned a great deal about what worked in terms of style, color, balance and design. As a fine artist, Arne considers himself self-taught. He studied paintings he saw in museums, took workshops from artists he admired and practiced his painting skills for 20 years.

He began by painting landscapes and discovered his favorite landscapes focused on figures. To Arne a figure or two added to a landscape always improved it. Figures add interest and scale. Landscape painting was very competitive in 1978 when Arne decided to support himself through his art. There were fewer figurative painters. Painting the human form was considered more difficult but, Arne chose to accept the challenge. He loved being around people, observing them, getting to know them and painting them. He liked people from all walks of life and enjoyed painting them in all kinds of settings. Arne chose to do what he loved most and was richly rewarded.

Arne Westerman's April AWA Workshop teaches his three-step design process. This process lets you know right away if your painting is likely to be successful. You will learn how to solve design problems before the actual painting takes place. He will teach you to paint richly colored watercolors of people in real life settings. Being able to paint people, capture the warmth, personality and attitude of the figure is a skill we'd all like to improve. Taking Arne's workshop is a giant step in the right direction.
